## **Active or Passive?**

We use the active form to say what the subject does.

- 1. I speak Chinese every day at work.
- 2. The mechanic repaired the flat tire on the car.

If you absolutely must use passive voice, use it only in these cases:

We use the passive form to say what happens to people and things, to say what is done to them.

- 1. English is spoken here.
- 2. The car is being repaired.

We use the passive form when we don't know who did the action.

- 1. The car was damaged while it was parked on the street.
- 2. The shirts were designed by someone on Madison Avenue in NYC.

We use the passive form when what was done is more important than who did it.

- 1. My raise was approved by Jerry last week.
- 2. I was informed of it by the human resources manager only two days ago.
